Background Information

Communications and Engagement Activity

Stakeholder Categorisation

The categories used to prioritise the stakeholders are listed below:

- Priority 1. Actively Engage Those with high levels of influence and interest:

 these are people/organisations who will have the most influence over the

 Board and its work and who we need to ensure remain positive and supportive
 of the Board. We will fully engage with, communicate regularly with and make
 the greatest efforts to satisfy those in this category.
- Priority 2. Keep Satisfied Those with high levels of influence but with less interest:

 these are people/organisations who have the ability to influence change but
 may not have high levels of interest in the detail of the Board or its work. We
 will ensure they know where to find relevant information should they want it.
- Priority 3. Keep Informed Those with low levels of influence but high levels of interest: these people/organisations have less influence over the Board but may be very interested in its work and be helpful with the detail of standards development. We will keep these people/organisations adequately informed, provide them with a route to give feedback as work progresses and ensure that they know where to find information if and when they need it.
- Priority 4. Occasionally Contact- Those with low levels of influence and less interest: these people/organisations have less influence and low levels of interest in the Board and its work. We will need to make them aware of the Board and its work, ensure that they know where to find current information and who to contact should they need to.
