

Code of Ethics Fire Standard consultation

The draft Code of Ethics Fire Standard, which the Fire Standards Board has put forward for consideration, is underpinned by the Core Code of Ethics for Fire and Rescue Services (England) (core code). Consultations on both are taking place at the same time and it is recommended that the Fire Standard and the core code are read and considered in parallel before responding to either of the consultations.

The consultation questions will ask for your views about the Fire Standard itself along with questions about the potential impact to your organisation should you work for a fire and rescue service within England. We encourage all fire and rescue services and governing authorities to provide a coordinated formal response, however we welcome individual responses from all fire and rescue and authority members and wider stakeholders.
